



Individuals will be eligible for ESFA funding if the learning is taking place in England, and they fulfil the residency requirements set out in one or more of the categories below.

Unless otherwise stated, individuals must be ordinarily resident in the UK on the first day of learning to meet the residency requirements.

1. UK NATIONALS AND OTHER PERSONS WITH RIGHT OF ABODE I am a UK national or other person with a right of abode in the UK and have been ordinarily resident in the UK, Republic of Ireland or British Overseas Territories or Crown Dependencies (Channel Islands and Isle of Man) for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning.
2. UK NATIONALS (AND FAMILY MEMBERS) IN THE EEA AND SWITZERLAND I am a UK national or family member (husband, wife, civil partner or child, grandchild, spouse's child or spouse's grandchild of the UK principal who is under 21 or dependant on the principal and/or his/her spouse, or the dependant parent or grandparent of the principal or of the principal's spouse) and have been living in the EEA or Switzerland on or before 31 December 2020 (or resident in the UK, having moved there from the EEA or Switzerland after 31 December 2017). I have lived in the EEA, Switzerland, Gibraltar or the EEA and UK for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning. I have remained ordinarily resident in the UK, Gibraltar, the EEA or Switzerland between 31 December 2020 and the start of the course and the start of the course. The course starts before January 2028.
3. EEA AND SWITZERLAND NATIONALS IN THE UK WITH EU SETTLEMENT SCHEME I am an EEA or Switzerland national and have obtained either pre-settled or settled status under the EU Settlement Scheme and have lived continuously in the EEA, Switzerland, Gibraltar or UK for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning.
4. EEA AND SWITZERLAND FRONTIER WORKERS I am an EEA or Switzerland frontier worker (or family member) and have been ordinarily resident in the UK, EEA and/or Switzerland for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning.
Note: EEA Frontier Worker's family members can be their husband, wife or civil partner, their child, grandchild or spouse/civil partner's grandchild (who is under 21 or dependent) or their dependent parents or grandparents. Swiss Frontier Worker's family members can be their husband, wife, civil partner or their child or spouse/civil partner's child or grandchild.
5. FAMILY MEMBERS OF EU NATIONALS I am a family member of an EU national (husband, wife, civil partner or child, grandchild, spouse's child or spouse's grandchild of the UK principal who is under 21 or dependant on the principal and/or his/her spouse, or the dependant parent or grandparent of the principal or of the principal's spouse). Where required to do so, I have obtained presettled or settled status under EUSS and the EU national (principal) has obtained pre-settled or settled status under EUSS and has been ordinarily resident in the UK, EEA and/or Switzerland for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning.
6. IRISH CITIZENS IN UK OR REPUBLIC OF IRELAND I am an Irish Citizen in the UK or Republic of Ireland have been ordinarily resident in the UK and Islands, and/or Republic of Ireland for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning.
7. IRISH CITIZENS IN EEA AND SWITZERLAND I am an Irish Citizen, I have resided in the EEA or Switzerland by 31 December 2020 (or resident in the UK, having moved to the UK from EEA or Switzerland after 31 December 2017). I resided in the EEA, Switzerland, Gibraltar or the UK for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning and remained ordinarily resident in the UK, Gibraltar, the EEA or Switzerland between 31 December 2020 and the start of the course and the course starts before January 2028
8. OTHER NON-UK NATIONALS I have been ordinarily resident in the UK and Islands for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning and (tick one box below) Have permission granted by the UK government to live in the UK and such permission is not for educational purposes only
Have obtained pre-settled or settled status under EUSS



9. 10. JOINING FAMILY MEMBERS UNDER THE EU SETTLEMENT SCHEME I am a family member (husband, wife, civil partner, child, grandchild or spouse's child or grandchild who is under 21 or a dependent) of an EEA or Swiss national and I applied to EUSS after 30 June 2021 and joined the family member in the UK on or after 1 April 2021. I applied to EUSS within 3 months of arriving in the UK. I have been ordinarily resident in the UK, Gibraltar, EEA, and/or Switzerland for at least the previous 3 years on the first day of learning.				
11. LONG RESIDENCE				
I have, on the first day of learning, lived in the UK for half of my life or a period of 20 years or more. \Box				
Evidence should be provided to confirm this status. This could be a confirmed entry date from Immigration Control, verified by the Home Office. Alternatively, you should provide evidence you have been living in the UK for the period in question. This should be from an official and independent source for example, letter from someone in leadership at the school you attended, a letter from your GP, wage slips or P45/P60.
